Gregory Peterson, Professor of Organ and Church Music, College Organist and Head of the Music Department at Luther College, Decorah, Iowa, will perform a recital on the 2001 67-rank Lively-Fulcher



pipe organ at St. Olaf Catholic Church in downtown Minneapolis on Saturday, April 26 at 1:30pm.

The concert program will include *Praeludium in G Major* by Nicolaus Bruhns, *Passacaglia* by G. Winston Cassler, *Rosaace* (*Rose Window*) from *Byzantine Sketches* by Henri Mulet

and *Sonata in One Movement on Kalenda Maya* by Libby Larsen, among others. A freewill offering will be taken at the recital and a reception will follow.

Gregory Peterson earned the BA degree in music at Luther College, Decorah, IA. He holds the MM degree from Yale University in the Institute of Sacred Music. He holds the DMA degree in organ performance and pedagogy from the University of Iowa. He undertook additional study at the Summer Institute for French Organ Study and at the Gothenburg International Organ Academy in Sweden.

A dedicated and expert professional church musician for more than twenty-five years, Dr. Peterson served the historic Old South Church in Boston as Organist and Minister of Music from 1997-2005. At Old South he directed the Old South Choir and Old South Ringers and performed regularly with the Old South Brass, Organ and Timpani Ensemble, including the ever-popular annual First Night Concerts on New Year's Eve. Prior to his appointment in Boston, he was Visiting Professor of Music and Christ Chapel Organist at Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter, MN. He has also been a visiting professor at Pacific Lutheran University in Tacoma, WA and served churches in Connecticut, Iowa, Minnesota and Washington.

On Sunday, Apr. 27 at 3 p.m. the 130-voice Vocal-Essence Chorus will perform alongside the Bethel Choir, Gustavus Choir, Luther Nordic Choir and the University of St. Thomas Chamber Singers at Bethel University's Benson Great Hall in *Tchaikovsky for Voices*. Minnesota Public Radio's classical music expert John Birge will host a pre-concert conversation about the renowned Russian composer. The soul-stirring *Tchaikovsky for Voices* will be the final concert of the 45th season by VocalEssence.

The famed vocal group, in combination with these four acclaimed student choirs, will welcome spring 300 voices strong with the music of Pyotr Tchaikovsky, who once wrote: "Music is indeed the most beautiful of all Heaven's gifts to humanity wandering in the darkness. Alone it calms, enlightens, and stills our souls." The program will showcase Tchaikovsky's *The Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom*, composed in 1878 from one of the most celebrated Eucharistic services of the Russian Orthodox Church, a liturgy that Tchaikovsky wrote would have every listener "stirred to the very depth of his being."

The music of Tchaikovsky will be enhanced by readings in Russian and English of poetry from the time of Tchaikovsky. In addition to the Tchaikovsky, each of the four college choirs will sing a solo set of music chosen by their conductor.

The musical spirit of Mexico will be celebrated by VocalEssence and area school children on Tuesday, May 20 at 7:00 p.m. in a family-friendly, bilingual performance at the Ordway Center for the Performing Arts. The VocalEssence Ensemble Singers, along with seven elementary and high school choirs from around the metro, will perform in the annual VocalEssence *¡Cantaré!'* Community Concert.

With the help of two Mexican composers-in-residence, the yearlong *¡Cantaré!* music education program encourages youth to discover Mexico's past and present musical traditions, to create new choral music and to sing in schools. In the 2013-2014 school year, Mexican composers José Galván Castañeda and Pamela Mayorga Tellez are spending four weeks in three separate visits to work with elementary, high school, and community choral singers, exploring Mexican cultural and choral music traditions.

This year, students from Minneapolis' Whittier Elementary School, St. Paul's Mississippi Creative Arts Magnet, Maple Grove Beacon Academy Charter School, Latino Children's Choir, Minneapolis' South High School Women's Choir, Anoka High School and Eagan High School are working with the Mexican composers to create eight new compositions. The composers were in the Twin Cities March 10-21 to prepare students for the May performance.
