Mackenzie will be assisted by six brass players and percussion.

Following the concert, there will be a reception, installation of officers and a catered dinner. The cost for dinner is \$25. Norman Mackenzie serves as Director of Music and Fine Arts and oversees a comprehensive program including seven singing and ringing choirs and two concert series at Trinity Presbyterian Church in Atlanta. He also serves as Director of Choruses for the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra, inheriting and continuing the legacy of legendary conductor Robert Shaw, and

maintains an active solo recital and guest conducting schedule each season. He holds degrees from the University of the Arts in Philadelphia and Westminster Choir College.

The program includes a splendid *Concerto for Organ, Brass and Percussion* (1969) and a virtuosic solo, *Organ Sonata* (1980), written for and dedicated to Mr. Mackenzie, who was Elmore's last student. AGO Region VI Convention

The Region VI AGO Convention was held in Springfield, MO from June 18-20, 2013. There were 126 participants from across the region, including six TCAGO members.

We heard a variety of organ recitals, including one by the Region VI Competition winner, Jessica Park. Jessica, a native of Woodbury, was the TCAGO Competition winner earlier this spring. She will perform a recital as a Rising Star at the 2014 National AGO Convention in Boston. Catherine Rodland led us in a hymn festival with music from a wide variety of traditions. We were also treated to a concert of a cappella music by the Springfield Chamber Chorus.

Several workshops were offered. The Professional Concerns workshop addressed ways to increase AGO membership and we were encouraged to promote the guild wherever we can. The session on the role of the organ in contemporary worship sparked a lively dis-

cussion. Having good communication between the leaders of traditional worship, contemporary worship and the clergy was stressed. We were reminded that our role is that of a servant, not a performer, and we are vessels to help others worship, no matter the worship style.

Other workshops included choral reading sessions, a class on how to care for our bodies to help prevent injuries, sessions on organ registration, British organ music, the Suzuki organ method (which included a 4-year-old performer!), and a master class led by James Kibbie.

Worship had a special place at the convention. We got to hear young organists from the region play on a variety of instruments. The singing is always good when the guild gathers and the homilies spoke to our work and artistry as choral directors and organists.

Any report would be incomplete without mentioning an important part of all conventions, namely, the time between recitals, workshops and worship. Meeting friends from across the region, both old and new, is always a delight. We share ideas for music that works for services and concerts and we can support each other in dealing with those sensitive, sometimes thorny, issues that we all experience. We can also encourage each other to prepare for the AGO exams.

Our thanks to the Springfield steering committee and chapter for all their work in planning for and making the convention a success. Conventions are a great way to meet our colleagues and support the AGO. Consider attending future regional and national conventions.

Twin Cities organist Jessica Park has won the Region VI AGO Young Artist Competition. She will appear in recital as a "Rising Star" during the Boston 2014 AGO National Convention. Jessica won the TCAGO Competition in April.



Jessica, from Woodbury, studied the piano with Dr. Paul Wirth and first began her organ studies at age 17 with Dr. Catherine Rodland, thanks to the generous *Pipedreams* Scholarship she received from the TCAGO chapter in 2008 and 2009.

Jessica is currently in her fifth year at the Oberlin Conservatory of Music, where she studies organ with James David Christie and harpsichord and

continuo with Webb Wiggins. In addition, she studied with Olivier Latry and Marie-Louise Langlais and has performed in masterclasses for Philippe Lefebvre and Francesco Cera. Jessica is currently working toward finishing the combined Bachelor's and Master's degree program in both organ and harpsichord at Oberlin. Additionally, she has studied the viola da gamba and baroque violin, and sings in the Oberlin Collegium Musicum.

In the summer of 2011, Jessica attended the McGill Summer Organ Academy in Montreal, where she studied with John Grew and continuo with Hank Knox. She has served as the organist and choir director at St. Paul's United Church of Christ in Parma, Ohio, and was organist at First Presbyterian Church in Huron, Ohio. Jessica has a keen interest in historical performance, and enjoys playing continuo in chamber settings. In her spare time, she likes to knit, and play basketball and tennis.




