One of the foremost concert organists of his generation, David Briggs enjoys a busy touring schedule that takes him all over the world. He has built a reputation as an exciting performer and communicator, with particular emphases on orchestral transcriptions and the art of improvisation. David is increasingly in demand as a composer.

Currently Artist-in-Residence at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine in New York City, (where he premiered his choir-and-organ transcription of Mahler's *Symphony of a Thousand* in 2015), David is also Organist *Emeritus* of Gloucester Cathedral, UK.


