Vincent Warnier Masterclass and Concert

Saturday, April 14, Masterclass, 9:00 a.m. - noon Sunday, April 15, Concert, 3:00 p.m. St. Thomas Aquinas Chapel University of St. Thomas

Vincent Warnier carries on the traditions of the French organists, performing his own improvisations alongside works by the great organ composers. He is the resident organist at the Église Saint-Étienne-du-Mont in Paris, where he succeeded Maurice Duruflé.

On Saturday, Warnier will teach a masterclass on the



Gabriel Kney organ in the Chapel at St. Thomas. Registration and hospitality will begin at 9:00 a.m. The masterclass is free to all, but registration at tcago.org is encouraged.

The concert on Sunday is part of his first tour in the U.S. He will perform works of Buxtehude, DeGrigny, Bach, Boëly, and improvise a symphony in four movements. The concert is free and open, and a reception will follow the performance.

The events are co-sponsored by the St. Thomas Department of Music, the UST Sacred Arts Festival, and the TCAGO. On Saturday and Sunday, free parking for the chapel is available in the Admissions Lot G, off Cleveland Avenue. More info on parking is available here.



provided five concerts, which allowed us to hear thirty-two pieces of music mostly by J.S. Bach, plus two by his son Wilhelm Friedemann. The organs in five churches provided the instruments, but we also heard a small positive organ and a lute; flute duets; a piano, violin, and flute trio; a solo violin; a viola; and two cellos. Seasoned older performers joined young teen-agers, all of them gracing us with carefully-prepared and skillful playing.

The audiences who filled the churches began with close to a hundred people at the first concert, plus the listeners on the radio for that one, and then increased with each successive concert to over two hundred at the last one. They included organists and organ enthusiasts, but others were there too. A pretty wide spectrum of people appeared to be present from many walks of life and stations in life, made all the more possible because anyone could afford the no-admission fee. Michael's requests for shows of hands indicated some people came to one or more of the concerts, but a goodly portion came to all five. In either case, they took time to attend to remarkably organized sound. That deserves some reflection.

In spaces filled with visual images that point beyond the daily round while simultaneously leading us back into service in it, we heard sounds that did the same thing. The raw sounds of the created order were crafted into their proleptic essence by one of humanity's most skilled composers who regarded his vocation as making ordered sounds for the glory of God and the refreshment of his neighbor. Whether the audiences knew exactly what Bach was doing or not, they listened up for something within and beyond our grasp.

These concerts of wordless music may not have been exactly what Bernard of Clairvaux had in mind when he said, "Listen and see...Hearing will restore your vision." His comments arose from singing words about the Word in monasteries where dropping a pin was said to yield the whole harmonic series. Though words about the Word stood behind some of Bach's pieces, we heard no words; and the acoustics were varied. Bernard's comments and what we experienced, however, both indicate the importance of hearing in giving us vision.

In the midst of a perpetual barrage of superficial sounds calculated to sell things and a clutter of sinister sounds meant to attack our neighbors, this over-flowing oasis attended to something else. We were refreshed. It was remarkable. We owe our deepest thanks to everyone who made it possible.

broadcast regularly on BBC Radio and been featured on American Public Media's Pipedreams. He is the Musical Director of the London Pro Arte Choir.



John Rutter, the legendary British composer and conductor, is one of choral music's most important living composers. Choirs all over the world perform his larger-scale



compositions like the devotional *Gloria* and spiritually exalting *Requiem*.

Rutter will conduct the Vocal-Essence Chorus & Ensemble Singers in *Feel the Spirit*, a cycle of his spiritual arrangements for mezzo-soprano, chorus, and chamber orchestra. He has written a new piece in honor of the upcoming 50th anniversary of VocalEssence,

and will premiere it in the sacred and glorious space of a cathedral more than a century old.

MPR

Classical Minnesota Public Radio encourages you to enter your classical music performance events in the MPR online calendar.

On the top bar of the general MPR web page, click on "Events," then "Events Calendar," then "Classical Music." However, if you find yourself on the Classical MPR main page, click on "More," then "Events," then "Classical Music."

In either case, once on the page that lists Classical Music Events, if you wish to add your own upcoming activity, under the headline for "Calendar Events Home" at the top of the page you should find an additional prompt for "Submit Event." Fill in all appropriate boxes (and check to see if your venue is already logged into the system, which might save you some time)

Note that this MPR Calendar information will reach a different audience than that submitted to Barone for posting on the TCAGO/ *Pipedreams* calendar pages. Both are free, the one a self-service feature and a separate vehicle by which you can let people (including the Classical MPR program hosts) know about your classical music concerts.

By all means, continue to send information directly to Michael Barone too!!

We also encourage you to regularly request organ selections on the "Friday Favorites" show with Steven Staruch. Encourage and promote the inclusion of more organ music in MPR's programming!
