Movie

Safety Last! is a 1923 American silent romantic comedy film starring Harold Lloyd. It includes one of the most famous images from the silent film era: Lloyd clutching the hands of a large clock as he dangles from the outside of a sky-scraper above moving traffic. The film was highly successful and critically hailed, and it cemented Lloyd's status as a major figure in early motion pictures. It is still popular at revivals, and it is viewed today as one of the great film comedies. The film's title is a play on the common expression, "safety first," which places safety as the priority to avoid accidents, especially at workplaces. Lloyd performed some of the climbing stunts himself, despite having lost a thumb and forefinger four years earlier in a film accident. Safety Last! is one of many works from 1923 that notably entered the public domain in the United States in 2019, the first time any works have done so in twenty years.

tember 2011. In 2005, Mark passed the AGO Service Playing Exam, and was the winner of the Minnesota Music Teachers' Association Young Artist Competition in Organ Performance. 
This year has been marked by wonderful celebrations and noteworthy collaborations. Our collaborative relationships with Michael Barone, *Pipedreams*, and MPR provide rich resources for the excellent programming offered by our chapter We had the opportunity to celebrate that partnership in a special way at the *Pipedreams* 35th anniversary concert at Wooddale Church last September. Concerts featuring the rededicated Aeolian-Skinner organ in Northrop Memorial Auditorium afforded another abundant avenue for collaboration and celebration – thanks to Dean Billmeyer and the committee (which included several TCAGO members) who steered those events.

Other important collaborative partners in this year's program included: the University of St. Thomas, Consortium Carissimi, Philip Brunelle and Plymouth Congregational Church, The Bach Society, the National Lutheran Choir, the Saint Paul Conservatory of Music, St. Olaf College, and Gustavus Adolphus College.

Furthermore, our collaboration with area churches enriches us, and represents significant AGO outreach to the community. The list is long here: Wooddale Church, Westminster Presbyterian Church, Bethlehem Lutheran Church, Bethle Lutheran Church, St. Philip the Deacon Lutheran Church, St. Thomas More Catholic Church, Unity Church Unitarian, House of Hope Presbyterian Church, the Cathedral of Saint Paul, Maternity of Mary Catholic Church. I probably have forgotten someone! However, I hope my point is clear – our programming, outreach, and educational offerings have an impressive, sweeping reach.

This has also been a spring of grief and loss. First, we were shocked to learn of the calamitous fire at Notre Dame in Paris – the spiritual "soul" of France, and cultural icon to the world. But we have learned that this house of God can be rebuilt, certainly as glorious as before. And recently we learned of the passing of our friend Kathryn Moen. She embodied in many ways the "soul" of the AGO, and of the many other communities she touched. But we have certain hope that she has gone to the heavenly mansion prepared for her.

In Memoriam

Kathryn Ulvilden Moen died on May 16, two days after her 99th birthday. A fixture of the Twin Cities church music/

organ scene, Kathryn graduated from Luther College in Decorah, lowa (where her father was a local pastor), with the class of 1941, earned a MM from Northwestern University and won a Fulbright scholarship to Norway where she studied at the *Kon-*



servatoriet. She later studied with Andre Marchal in Paris and with Heinrich Fleischer at the University of Minnesota. She and her late husband Norman were inveterate travelers, at home and abroad, and spent many summers hiking in the Grand Tetons.

Kathryn taught for 30 years at the University of Wisconsin-River Falls, retiring at age 86! She held various church positions including Bethlehem Lutheran Church in south Minneapolis where she was instrumental in the selection of the then-new Casavant organ back in the 1960s, and later at St. Anthony Park Lutheran Church. Kathryn attended


summer organ seminars in the Netherlands, France, Norway, and the Czech Republic. Indeed, following one such event in Prague in the 1970s, prior to the "end of communism," she came back to Minnesota with a pile of music by Czech composers, most of which was unavailable in "the west." She learned a bunch of it and gave a concert at the Northwestern Lutheran Theological Seminary Chapel (just two blocks from her home in the St. Anthony Park neighborhood of Saint Paul). She later made an LP album of that repertoire, which later was reissued in CD format.

Kathryn could always be found in a crowd, as she wore her very long and prematurely very white hair in a bun, and during the past half century presented the image of a "little old lady school teacher." She was extremely proud of her niece, soprano Elizabeth Holleque of Fargo, and travelled often to hear her, including at the Metropolitan Opera. Kathryn's energy and enthusiasm was legendary, until the strokes of several years ago. She sometimes drove her Mercedes sedan (very fast) to and from Decorah in a single day in order to participate in some event at Luther College. She also played piano and cello, and was a regular participant in activities of The Thursday Musical. Her vibrant personality and appealing musicianship brought her in contact with an ever-widening circle of friends. She will be remembered, and missed.

As one of her colleagues described her, "she was a beautiful, gracious and grand dame of the organ, whose long life was dedicated to music."

R.I.P. Kathryn Ulvilden Moen...you and Norman are together again.
