



Dean's Column

An Instructive Summer

During the first two weeks of June, David Cherwien and I taught courses at Concordia University Wisconsin. James Freese, who directs the Master of Church Music degree there, could not teach the courses because he had to give seventy hours of private organ lessons in one month. To make the lessons fit, some students – most of whom were organ majors from various denominations – missed some of our classes.



In the second week of July the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians met in the Twin Cities. The opening eucharist was at Augustana Church in West St. Paul where the TCAGO video for organ committees had been made. (The service had to be moved to Augustana because a lightning strike had made the Boe Chapel organ at St. Olaf College unusable.) The next sessions met at Westminster Presbyterian, Central Lutheran, and St. Olaf Catholic churches. These were followed by a trip to St. John's Abbey for Evening Prayer with the monks, where Lutherans and Catholics together remembered the 500th anniversary of the Reformation.

The following week the Hymn Society in the United States and Canada met in Waterloo, Canada, with the same theme the Lutherans and monks had at the Abbey, but in a Mennonite part of the world with a widely diverse set of conference participants. Michael Burkhardt played the opening hymn festival. It was followed by nightly hymn festivals in other churches, daily plenaries, and breakout sessions on a rich mix of topics. The conference had over 300 registrants, and the hymn festivals packed the churches with over 700 people each night.

During the first two weeks of August, the Organ Historical Society met in the Twin Cities for a quite remarkable festival of organs, organists, and organ music in this part of the country. Unfortunately, I missed almost all of it, but could not miss its quality and breadth.

Two things stand out about these events: 1) the health of the organ, and 2) the "denominationally-promiscuous" (to quote Erik Routley) character of the participants. Our TCAGO opening event on September 17 at St. Bartholomew's Catholic Faith Community in Wayzata signaled these same qualities.

In a world of divisions and warfare, I continue to be amazed at what the organ signifies. I know it sometimes seems to be drowned out in the louder noise pollution of our time. But things are not always what they seem to be. Remember the mustard seed or the immensities packed into a few minutes of Bach's *Christ lag* from the *Orgelbüchlein*. Or, as a very short friend of mine told me when we were young kids delivering papers, "Dynamite [which can be used constructively] comes in small packages."

Faythe Freese Organ Recital

Sunday, October 1, 3:00 p.m. Augustana Lutheran Church, West St. Paul

Faythe Freese, Professor of Organ at the University of Alabama School of Music, will present a program including

works by J.S. Bach, Tournemire, Franck, and Hakim. The closing work will be the Minnesota premiere of Pamela Decker's The Freese Collec*tion.* a work commissioned by Freese. The composition is a tribute to three works of art by the artist known as "Nall," which are displayed in Faythe's home.



Dr. Freese was the first American woman to record at L'Eglise de la Sainte-Trinité, Paris, on the landmark instrument where Guilmant, Messiaen, and Hakim were titular organists. She has been a featured lecturer and concert artist at the national and regional conventions of the American Guild of Organists in Boston, Washington, D.C., Greensboro, NC, and San Antonio.

She holds degrees in organ performance and church music from Indiana University. Her organ teachers and coaches have included Marilyn Keiser, Robert Rayfield, William Eifrig, Phillip Gehring, Dame Gillian Weir, Simon Preston, and Daniel Roth.

The recital is free and open to the public. A reception follows the concert. Child care is available.



Organs Available

Michael Barone, collator

These are intriguing times. Incredible new instruments are being installed in churches across the country, even as superb instruments...some not particularly old...are being displaced, either due to 'change of worship style' of the former owners or actual closing of parishes.

As a result, there are quite a number of perfectly fine second-hand organs available on the market, always at prices considerably less than the cost of an equivalent new organ, some astonishingly inexpensive. Of course, these instruments come with the limitation that they must be fit into spaces similar to those that originally housed them, but still...

If you have a personal need for a studio instrument, or know of a congregation that is considering a pipe organ for their new or present church, these projects deserve your attention.

Here's a brief summary of some that have come to my notice:

MPR

Classical Minnesota Public Radio encourages you to enter your classical music performance events in the MPR online calendar.

On the top bar of the general MPR web page, click on "Events," then "Events Calendar," then "Classical Music." However, if you find yourself on the Classical MPR main page, click on "More," then "Events," then "Classical Music."

In either case, once on the page that lists Classical Music Events, if you wish to add your own upcoming activity, under the headline for "Calendar Events Home" at the top of the page you should find an additional prompt for "Submit Event." Fill in all appropriate boxes (and check to see if your venue is already logged into the system, which might save you some time).

Note that this MPR Calendar information will reach a different audience than that submitted to Barone for posting on the TCAGO/ *Pipedreams* calendar pages. Both are free, the one a selfservice feature and a separate vehicle by which you can let people (including the Classical MPR program hosts) know about your classical music concerts.
