Dean's Column

New Board Members

The Board for the coming year includes both old and new members. You returned to office the Dean, Sub-Dean, Secretary, and Treasurer. The class of 2018 also remains the same. The class of 2020, whom you just elected, is composed of Tom Ferry, Diana Lee



Lucker, and Chris Stroh. I wrote about that in June and about the replacement of Nancy Lancaster by Kyle Black in the class of 2019. Since then Kalle Ackerman, also in the class of 2019, took a choral teaching position in Rochester. He has now been replaced by Rob Glover. Mike Edwins, our faithful Chaplain for many years, is retiring – a retirement he has more than earned. We will acknowledge that at the dinner meeting on September 17. He has been replaced by John Setterlund. Welcome to all of these new members, and thanks to those who will no longer be with us.

As usual, this year's Board is composed of quite able people who, I'm sure, will continue a high level of work and commitment. I have found the Board, the committees, their chairs, people in other posts, and TCAGO members generally to be not only able, but willing to take responsibility for all of the tasks that need to be done. That is, of course, the only way an organization like this one functions. Thanks to all of you for all that you do to make it function so well.

Trade Commission Compliance

One of the first things on the Board's agenda this year was complying with the Federal Trade Commission's requirements. I wrote about this in the February issue of *Pipenotes*. James Thomashower wrote about it in the October issue of *TAO* in 2016 and again in the August issue this year. There is nothing new now. We are simply carrying out what we expected.

At the August Board meeting we did the two things that are required for us to continue to be affiliated with the American Guild of Organists. As Dean, I will sign the Certification form that attests to these actions. We removed all "restrictions on competing for positions or engagement," and we removed all "restrictions on competing on price-related terms." The Code of Ethics and the Code of Professional Standards in our 2016-2017 Membership Directory (adopted in 2007) have been replaced by the Code of Ethics and Code for Professional Standards on pp. 8 and 9 of *TAO*, August, 2017 (adopted in 2017). They are on the TCAGO website.

This means we 1) cannot follow the rule that said we shall not seek a position held by someone else and 2) cannot publish salary guidelines. The new Codes still require

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responsible conduct toward others and allow us to point those who are clueless about salaries (the usual nature of the requests we receive) to agencies like denominational church offices.

The Board and I are aware that many of us have questions about these changes. As I indicated in February, our challenge is to live within the legal requirements of our time and place, but yet with counter-cultural concerns for the neighbor and the common good. Harvey Cox and Pope Francis have taught us well that the market is not God and that it kills when its competition is construed destructively. The AGO knows that and needs to continue to live out its truth.



The Bakken Trio presents *NADIA*, a unique marriage of chamber music and theater. Actress/singer Christina Baldwin appears in the role of Nadia Boulanger as she explores the memories and secrets behind this charismatic music teacher who launched 1000 composers. Violinist Stephanie Arado and pianist Michael Kim trigger Nadia's memories by performing music of her sister Lili, and of her students Aaron Copland, Astor Piazzola, and Quincy Jones in an original script by Mina Fisher. The production is directed by Steven Epp.

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The story of Nadia Boulanger is almost unknown. Because of her distrust of the written word, she refused interviews and biographies until the last years of her life. Much of the play is based on stories told to the author by Nadia's students Stanislaw Skrowaczewski, David Grayson, Kenneth Coe and Michael Conte, plus quotes taken from Don Campbell's book and the Léonie Rosentheil biography.

Boulanger taught David Conte, Ned Rorem, Virgil Thomson, Enid Woodward (late of Carleton College), and others in the organ community.

Kola Owolabi in Concert

Kola Owolabi is Associate Professor of Organ at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor, where he teaches courses in organ, improvisation and sacred music. From 2006



to 2014, he taught at Syracuse University and served as University Organist. He also held positions as Sub Dean and Dean of the Syracuse Chapter of the American Guild of Organists.

The concert on the 56-rank Gabriel Kney tracker organ will include works by Muffat, Cabanilles, Correa de Arauxo, Bach, Handel, Decker, Hampton, and Duruflé.

Dr. Owolabi is a published composer and has received commissions from the Royal Canadian College of Organists and the Catholic Archdiocese of Toronto. His solo organ composition *Dance* was selected for the Royal Canadian College of Organists National Competition in August 2013, where all of the finalists performed this composition.

He holds degrees in organ performance and choral conducting from McGill University, Montreal, Yale University

and Eastman School of Music. His former teachers include Bruce Wheatcroft, John Grew, Martin Jean, Thomas Murray, Hans Davidsson and William Porter.

The concert is free, and a reception will follow. Parking is available in Lot G (enter from Cleveland Avenue near Ashland), or the parking ramp at Grand and Cretin.

For a listing of organ events statewide, access the Pipedreams Organ Calendar. For both on-air and website listings of organ-related activities, please send information to Michael Barone, or to Pipedreams Calendar, 480 Cedar St., Saint Paul, MN 55101.

MPR

Classical Minnesota Public Radio encourages you to enter your classical music performance events in the MPR online calendar.

On the top bar of the general MPR web page, click on "Events," then "Events Calendar," then "Classical Music." However, if you find yourself on the Classical MPR main page, click on "More," then "Events," then "Classical Music."

In either case, once on the page that lists Classical Music Events, if you wish to add your own upcoming activity, under the headline for "Calendar Events Home" at the top of the page you should find an additional prompt for "Submit Event." Fill in all appropriate boxes (and check to see if your venue is already logged into the system, which might save you some time).

Note that this MPR Calendar information will reach a different audience than that submitted to Barone for posting on the TCAGO/ Pipedreams calendar pages. Both are free, the one a selfservice feature and a separate vehicle by which you can let people (including the Classical MPR program hosts) know about your classical music concerts.

By all means, continue to send information directly to Michael Barone too!!

We also encourage you to regularly request organ selections on the "Friday Favorites" show with Steven Staruch. Encourage and promote the inclusion of more organ music in MPR's programming!
